Truth to carry into the week.

01 Jehovah Shalom is the Lord, our peace—the One who brings wholeness, soundness, and completeness.

- God's peace is deeper than an emotion; it is His spiritual force at work within the believer. ([Philippians 4:7](#))
- Shalom includes welfare, health, tranquility, reconciliation, friendship, and a sound mind. (3 John 2)
- Peace remains present even when outward circumstances are troubled because its source is God Himself. ([John 14:27](#))

"Jehovah Shalom. The Lord, our peace."

02 God speaks peace and identity in the middle of conflict, fear, weakness, and uncertainty.

- Gideon was hiding from the Midianites when God addressed him as a mighty man of valor. ([Judges 6:11-12](#))
- The Lord answered Gideon's fear with shalom: peace, wholeness, and the assurance that he would not die. ([Judges 6:22-24](#))
- Peace did not remove Gideon's assignment; it enabled him to rise, obey, tear down idols, and move in God's strength. ([Judges 6:25-27](#))

"Whatever war may be waging around you, and if you feel weak, just know that God is saying peace to you."

03 Jesus made peace through the blood of His cross and reconciled the offended and the offender to God.

- Christ reconciled all things to Himself, making peace through His perfect blood. ([Colossians 1:19-22](#))
- The chastisement necessary for our peace was laid upon Jesus, and by His stripes we are healed. ([Isaiah 53:5-6](#))
- The finished work of the cross gives peace, while believers continue grounded and steadfast in faith. ([Colossians 1:23](#))

"His peace is our portion through the blood."

04 People are not the enemy; spiritual warfare is waged without repaying evil for evil.

- Believers wrestle against spiritual powers rather than flesh and blood. ([Ephesians 6:12](#))
- As far as it depends upon the believer, the command is to live peaceably with all people. ([Romans 12:17-18](#))
- Forgiveness, restitution, prayer, and righteous justice work toward reconciliation without excusing wrongdoing. ([Colossians 3:13-15](#))

"We don't wrestle against flesh and blood."

05 Peace must be guarded because no person or circumstance has authority to take what Jesus gave.

- Jesus gives peace differently from the world and commands the heart not to remain troubled or afraid. ([John 14:27](#))
- God's peace is allowed to rule when the believer refuses agreement with fear, bitterness, anxiety, or offense. ([Colossians 3:15](#))
- The Shepherd restores the soul and remains present even through the valley of the shadow of death. ([Psalm 23:1-4](#))

"Nobody can take your peace."

06 Jesus sends believers into their assignment with peace and the power of the Holy Spirit.

- The risen Jesus stood among fearful disciples and declared peace before commissioning them. ([John 20:19-21](#))
- He breathed upon them and told them to receive the Holy Spirit for the work ahead. ([John 20:22](#))
- Peace is not passivity; it is the armor and victory from which God's people obey with clarity and courage. ([Romans 16:20](#))

"Peace is your weapon. Peace is your armor. Peace is your victory."
