## Truth to carry into the week.

### 01 Christ's strength becomes most effective where natural ability reaches its limit.

- Paul's weakness did not cancel his calling; it became the place where the power of Christ could rest upon him. ([2 Corinthians 12:9-10](#))
- God's grace is sufficient against hardship, opposition, and every demand attached to His assignment.
- Weakness is not permission to quit; it is an invitation to depend upon the strength Jesus supplies.

*"My grace is sufficient for you."*

### 02 Grace is God's influence upon the heart becoming visible through a surrendered life.

- The Potter can remake a marred vessel when the clay remains in His hands. ([Jeremiah 18:1-6](#))

- Communion with Jesus and the Holy Spirit positions the heart to receive His influence. ([2 Corinthians 13:11-14](#))
- Humility admits the need for God and receives the grace that pride resists. ([James 4:6](#))

***“You must posture yourself in humility in order to receive the divine influence upon your heart.”***

### **03 Grace must be received, stewarded, and put to work rather than treated as something vain.**

- Paul labored abundantly, yet he credited the grace of God working with him. ([1 Corinthians 15:9-10](#))
- God prepared good works beforehand, and grace empowers believers to walk in them. ([Ephesians 2:10](#))
- A believer honors grace by cooperating with God instead of burying the assignment He supplied.

***“His grace for me is not in vain.”***

### **04 Grace supplies the ability to obey whatever God has genuinely called you to do.**

- Grace and peace multiply through the knowledge of Jesus, not through confidence in self. ([2 Peter 1:2-4](#))
- Receiving abundant grace enables believers to reign in life through Jesus Christ. ([Romans 5:17](#))
- The assignment may exceed natural strength, but it will never exceed the grace God gives for His will.

***“With enough grace, there’s nothing you cannot do that God’s called you to do.”***

## 05 Growing in grace means growing in relationship, knowledge, correction, and likeness to Jesus.

- Believers are commanded to grow in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. ([2 Peter 3:17-18](#))
- His promises make it possible to partake of the divine nature and escape corruption. ([2 Peter 1:3-4](#))
- A good Father corrects and directs His children so their lives reflect His character with maturity.

*“We want the grace of God to rest and dwell and pitch a tent over us.”*

## 06 The grace upon a believer's life is given to reveal Jesus and reach other people.

- Grace turns testimony into evidence of what Jesus can do through a yielded person. ([Acts 13:22](#))
- Personal preferences, fear, and past experiences must not overrule obedience to God's purpose.
- The life purchased by Jesus is meant to serve, endure, and carry His goodness to the souls He loves. ([2 Corinthians 5:14-15](#))

*“The grace of God upon your life is strictly for the souls of men.”*
