NOTES

Truth to carry into the week.

01 Every new season requires fresh grace, because natural strength cannot finish a spiritual race.

- The mountain does not move by human might or power, but by the Spirit of God. ([Zechariah 4:6-7](#))
- Grace is God's present provision for the obstacles, responsibilities, and transitions of this season.
- Do not measure the assignment by your own ability; receive the grace that enables you to continue and finish.

"The only way that we're going to win this race is through His grace."

02 Grace is a gift to receive, not a reward to earn.

- Salvation is by grace through faith; it is the gift of God and cannot be produced by human works. ([Ephesians 2:8-9](#))

- Grace and truth came through Jesus Christ, and believers receive from His fullness. ([John 1:16-17](#))
- Trust, humility, and surrender position the heart to receive what pride and self-reliance resist. ([1 Peter 5:5-6](#))

“Grace is a free gift.”

03 Grace does not excuse passivity; it empowers obedience, labor, and good works.

- Believers are God’s workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for the good works He prepared beforehand. ([Ephesians 2:10](#))
- Paul labored abundantly, yet he recognized that the grace of God working through him supplied the ability. ([1 Corinthians 15:10](#))
- Spiritual gifts are given to be opened, developed, and used for the strengthening of the Body of Christ.

04 Grace trains the believer to reject sin and grow into holiness and maturity.

- The grace of God teaches believers to deny ungodliness and worldly lusts and to live soberly, righteously, and godly. ([Titus 2:11-12](#))
- Receiving more light, opportunity, and gifting also brings greater responsibility and accountability. ([Luke 12:48](#))
- Repentance keeps the heart yielded; grace draws a believer closer to Jesus rather than back toward rebellion.

“His grace is always pulling me and drawing me closer to Him.”

05 Do not receive grace in vain; yield to what God has placed within you.

- Now is the accepted time and the day of salvation, so grace must receive a present response. ([2 Corinthians 6:1-2](#))

- The church needs every believer to rise in maturity and faithfully steward the gifts God has supplied.
- Weakness does not disqualify you; God's sufficient grace causes His strength to rest upon surrendered lives. ([2 Corinthians 12:9](#))

"Please do not receive the grace of God in vain."

06 Grace gives peace for the next step and faithfulness for the entire journey.

- God may lead through a still small voice; slow down, listen, and refuse to move ahead of His peace. ([1 Kings 19:11-13](#))
- Continue loving Jesus through every circumstance, confident that God works all things together for good. ([Romans 8:28](#))
- He who began the good work will complete it, so keep your heart guarded and your eyes fixed forward. ([Philippians 1:6](#); [Proverbs 4:20-27](#))
