NOTES

Truth to carry into the week.

01 Jesus did not shed His blood merely to improve life; He came to take away sin.

- Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. ([John 1:29](#))
- Remission required the shedding of blood, and Christ supplied the sacrifice the old system could never complete. ([Hebrews 9:22](#))
- He bore our sins in His own body so that we could die to sin and live for righteousness. ([1 Peter 2:24](#))

"Jesus did not come to simply give us a better life. Jesus shed His blood to take away our sin."

02 Disappointed expectations become dangerous when they turn the heart against Jesus.

- Judas remained at the table while his heart rejected the way Jesus was fulfilling God's plan. ([Luke 22:21-22](#))
- Peter also resisted the cross, but correction gave him an opportunity to remain surrendered. ([Matthew 16:23](#))
- Present hardship must be measured against the glory God will reveal, not against personal expectations. ([Romans 8:18](#))

“Don’t let your heart turn on Him because He hasn’t fulfilled your expectations.”

03 Communion declares that the new covenant is established in the blood of Jesus.

- The broken bread remembers His body given for us, and the cup remembers His blood poured out for us. ([Luke 22:19-20](#))
- The covenant took effect through the death of the One who made it and cannot be altered by human effort. ([Hebrews 9:16-17](#))
- Believers examine their hearts and receive the elements in remembrance of Jesus. ([1 Corinthians 11:23-29](#))

“This cup is the new covenant.”

04 Kingdom greatness is revealed through service, humility, and love rather than position.

- Jesus answered the disciples' argument about greatness by pointing them toward the one who serves. ([Luke 22:24-27](#))
- The Lord washed His disciples' feet and commanded them to follow His example. ([John 13:12-17](#))
- The new commandment requires believers to love one another as Jesus loved them. ([John 13:34-35](#))

“As long as we’re focused on our own greatness, we’re going to miss the lesson that Jesus gave us, which is service.”

05 Walking in the covenant means receiving forgiveness and extending that same grace to others.

- Confession receives God's faithful forgiveness and cleansing from all unrighteousness. ([1 John 1:9](#))
- Those who are in Christ Jesus are no longer governed by condemnation. ([Romans 8:1](#))
- The reconciled become ministers of reconciliation because God no longer charges their sins against them. ([2 Corinthians 5:19-21](#))

"You have to receive love to give love. You have to receive grace to give grace. You have to receive mercy to give mercy."

06 Faith places Jesus on the throne by surrendering personal control to His lordship.

- Jesus brought His will under the Father's will before going to the cross. ([Luke 22:42](#))
- The surrendered believer is crucified with Christ and lives by faith in the Son of God. ([Galatians 2:20](#))
- Trust refuses to lean on personal understanding and acknowledges Him in every decision. ([Proverbs 3:5-6](#))

"Faith is: I trust Him. I trust Him with my life. I trust Him with my family. I trust Him with my finances."
